ORDER ESTABLISHING KENSINGTON POLICE PROTECTION DISTRICT

WHEREAS, a petition as required by Section 20026 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California, has heretofore been filed with the Board of Supervisors of Contra Costa County, and notice of the time and place for presenting said petition to the said Board of Supervisors has been posted as required by Section 20028 of the said code and said notice has been published for the time and in the manner as prescribed by law in the El Cerrito Journal, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the County of Contra Costa, State of California, as required in Section 20029 of said Health and Safety Code, as shown by the affidavit of publication by William H. Schaefer on file herein; and the Boundaries Commission of said County of Contra Costa having submitted a report on and having approved and recommended the boundaries of the said proposed Kensington Police Protection District; and

WHEREAS, on the 6th day of May, 1946, an Engineer's Report was filed by C. L. Dunklee, a duly qualified and licensed engineer, with said Board of Supervisors showing that the said Kensington Police Protection District was a feasible project and containing all the matters called for under Section 6, of the District Investigations Act of 1933 and amendments thereto (Act 2119 Deering's General Laws); and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of hearing of said Engineer's Report was published for the time and in the manner prescribed by Section 11 of said Act in the Richmond Daily Independent, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the County of Contra Costa, State of California, as

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shown by the affidavit of publication by William H. Schaefer; and

WHEREAS, it further appears from the affidavit of Walter T. Paasch, County Clerk, on file herein that notice of hearing of the Engineer's Report was mailed as required by Section 11 of said Act; and

WHEREAS, the hearing on the petition for the formation of said Kensington Police Protection District was set for May 6, 1946, at 11 o'clock A.M., in the Chambers of the said Board of Supervisors and was regularly continued until the 17th day of June, 1946, at 10 o'clock A.M. in the Chambers of said Board of Supervisors; and

WHEREAS, the hearing on the said Engineer's Report as required by the District Investigations Act of 1933, as aforesaid, was set as Monday, the 17th day of June, 1946, at the hour of 10 o'clock A.M.; and

WHEREAS, prior to the hearing of the petition of the formation of said District, there were filed with the Clerk of said Board letters and petitions objecting to the formation of said District; and

WHEREAS, the Board after having considered said petitions over-ruled the same; and

WHEREAS, said Board believes that the boundaries of the said proposed Kensington Police Protection District to be those defined in the said original petition and that it is for the benefit of said territory that a police protection district be formed therein.

NOW, THEREFORE, the said Board of Supervisors hereby finds that all of the petitioners signing the original petition for the formation of said district were and are taxpayers and residents of the unincorporated territory described therein. The said Board further finds that the Boundaries Commission of said County of Contra Costa, has approved the boundaries of the said proposed district as set out in said petition.

The said Board further finds that the said Engineer's report containing the matters called for by Section 6 of the District Investigations Act of 1933 and amendments thereto, was filed with the said Board of Supervisors on the 6th day of May, 1946, showing that said district is a feasible and practical project; that said Board of Supervisors further finds that according to said Engineer's Report, the total amount of proposed assessments and taxes as estimated under Subdivisions 4 to 9, inclusive of Part 4 of Section 6 of the District Investigations Act of 1921, as amended (Deering's General Laws), upon any parcel or parcels of real property in the proposed district, will not exceed one-third ($1/3$) of the true value of such parcel or parcels of property whose assessed value, separately or in the aggregate, exceeds five per cent (5%) of the total assessed value of all real property within the proposed district; the Board further finds that the total amount of assessments and taxes and proposed assessments and taxes, as estimated under Subdivisions 4 to 9, inclusive of Part F of Section 6 of this act, upon all the real property within the district, will not exceed one-third ($1/3$) the true value of all the real property within the proposed district.

The said Board further finds that there is no real property included within the said proposed district that will not be benefited by the said proposed district and therefore, denies all protests heretofore filed with the Clerk of said Board. That the said Board does hereby find that the Kensington Police Protection District of Contra Costa County in the County of Contra Costa, be and the

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same is hereby formed and is a valid and presently existing district and the boundaries of said district shall include the following described property, to-wit:

PARCEL ONE
